

10301 New Vocabulary, Jain Chapter 8, Possessive Forms

Remember, with adjectives, if the notation is *madj* it is a 'marked' adjective and the ending will change to agree with the noun it is modifying or describing. If the notation is simply *adj* it cannot change.
