

## 14600 The Waiter Has To Smile - Game

Below are some pattern sentences that can be used in the game “The Waiter Has To Smile”. In this game a group of people have gone out to eat and seem determined to drive the waiter crazy by constantly changing their orders, complaining, making unreasonable demands, etc. (although always using polite language). And of course the waiter must ‘keep smiling’. Most of these pattern sentences involve uses of को or its alternate form (either as the personal object of the verb [Jain Ch. 11] or in Indirect Verb Constructions [Jain Ch. 13]. I’ve also added some Indirect Verb Constructions with the verb चाहिये (literally ‘is needed’, but often used where English chooses ‘want’. In addition, the Title Sentence (‘The waiter has to smile’ is an example of the Indirect Verb Construction used with many verbs and translates as ‘has to’ or ‘have to’. So this game becomes a way to practice these types of sentences.

वेटर को मुसकराना है।	The waiter has to smile.
क्या सेवा करें आप लोगों की?	What can I do for you folks?
क्या पीना चाहिये आप को?	What do you want (need) to drink?
मुझे चाय चाहिये।	I would like tea.
आप को क्या खाना चाहिये?	What do you want to eat?
मुझे पकोड़े दीजिये।	Give me pakodas (please).
मुझे पानी मत दीजिये।	Don't give me water.
मुझे निम्बू पसंद नहीं है।	I don't like/care for lemon.
भूल गया। आप को क्या चाहिये?	I forgot. What do you want?
मुझे मालूम नहीं। क्या क्या हैं?	I don't know. What all is there?
मुझे बीमार है। उस को भी बीमार है।	I'm sick. He/She's sick too.

मुझे यह खाना पसंद नहीं।	I don't like this food.
वापस ले जाइये।	Take it back, please.
